Features of PCCC

- ✦ It brings parents/grandparents and kids to a planned activity which is Nepali language centered.
- ✦ Volunteers or facilitators plan child-centered activities that involves parents alongside their kids in a classroom.
- ✦ Kids listen to stories, speak with peers or to the group and do some reading and writing. Kids love coloring and this is also what they do in the class.
- ✦ It comes on Saturday mornings for now and is especially meant for kids over three years of age. Plan is to extend to kids of higher age group.
- ✦ As more parents and children show interest and understand the importance of being a dual language speaker, we hope to extend the program to each neighborhood, making it accessible to all who need.
- ✦ The classes are open to any Bhutanese family residing in the Greater Pittsburgh region, and of course there is no any fee.
